Your comments on this draft decision:

PROPOSED FEED-IN RATES TOO LOW

The feed in rates specified in the draft decision are too low, unfair, and a disincentive to install a solar system. A 3 cent drop per kmh is not justified.

The rates should not be reduced while energy companies (such as Ausnet) are allowed to limit export volume. The rates Victorians are charged for electricity still sit at 28 cents and above.

Daily service fees have not changed. The available information does not show electricity is currently cheaper for most Victorians.
