Since the start of the Rebate at 90 cents per kilowatt. It dropped to 70 cents, then 60 cents, and now 1.1 cents. Yet the price for electricity has risen, and risen, at their convenience. Service, Supply charges also ho up with out proper notice. If you are on a contract, then all prices should remain the same? But no, they change them after a few months. The feed in tariff needs to be just over half of the price we pay, including the Service and Supply charges. So I believe it should be around 25 cents a kilowatt for our investment.
