







## Purpose of this forum

# TCV's application

TCV has applied for a licence to transmit electricity under the *Electricity Industry Act 2000 (EIA)*.

It plans to use this licence to:

transmit electricity in connection with the Victoria New South Wales Interconnector West (VNI West) project in Victoria.

TCV's application form, and associated public documents, can be found on the commission's website and on Engage Victoria.

## Role of the Essential Services Commission in energy

In relation to electricity, we are responsible for:

- licensing businesses involved in transmitting electricity in Victoria under the Electricity Industry Act 2000
- establishing and maintaining codes and guidelines
- promoting and enforcing compliance with the codes
- reporting on the performance of energy businesses and on energy prices.

#### Transmission licence application – what we assess

The commission will only grant a transmission licence where:

- it is satisfied that the applicant has the technical capacity to comply with the conditions of the licence
- it considers appropriate having regard to the commission's statutory objectives
- the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold a transmission licence

Refer to our <u>Guideline: Applications for electricity and gas industry licences</u> for more information. The guideline includes information to assist people to understand our licensing process.

#### Transmission licence application – technical capacity

The commission's assessment of technical capacity can occur in stages.

- Large infrastructure projects may not carry out the licenced activities of transmitting electricity for more than 12 months after being licenced.
- Section 19(4) of the EIA allows the commission to grant the licence subject to further approval ahead of the licenced activities taking place.

#### Content of a transmission licence

If a transmission licence is granted it may contain a range of standard conditions such as:

- Notices
- Grant of the licence
- Change of control
- Compliance with regulatory instruments
- Ongoing technical capacity

The commission may also include special licence conditions in a licence to limit the scope of the licensee's activities or address bespoke risks.

## How to provide feedback

Interested persons are invited to make submissions on TCV's application.
