With the cost of living increasing, it's frustrating that I can't shop around for a better deal, and that I'm locked in to paying such high prices. Customer service is also an issue with embedded networks - any time I've had a problem with by account it's taken weeks to solve because Win Energy knows I can't go anywhere else.

I suggest landlords be required to flag with potential tenants that a property is on an embedded network, so tenants can make an informed choice when choosing a place to live."
