Are there any other matters relevant to the review we should consider?

Consumers installed solar in order to pay back costs of same and to receive much cheaper power than non-solar consumers. Higher feed-in tariffs existed when I installed my solar and it was a major driving factor in this decision and expense which I believed would continue. I recently was to expand my solar however decided against the expense due to the dwindling feed-in tariffs.

Consumers installed solar to have far cheaper energy bills than non-solar consumers but now the gap is minimal. I believe this is grossly unfair to those who have installed solar on an apparently false belief. Tariffs should remain high enough so we may benefit from our decision, not question why we ever installed solar.
