## Q6. Do you have any concerns with obligations which have been updated or amended? Please explain any concerns.

EnergyAustralia believes the ESC's proposed obligations for exempt distributors (embedded network operators) to mimic the planned interruptions notification requirements of distribution businesses is a reasonable inclusion; however, it is important to consider that exempt distributors are reliant on receiving this information from distribution businesses.

Therefore, if an exempt distributor is required to provide notification to customers in the same timeframe as a distribution business, there should be an additional requirement that distribution business provided, at least, an extra two business days notice (on top of their existing notification requirements) to an exempt distributor. This will allow a reasonable timeframe for this notification to be processed and passed on from the exempt distributor to their customers.
