Response to the Essential Services Commission Draft Decision on the South Dynon Terminal Access Arrangement

Under the Rail Management Act (1996) (Victoria) the South Dynon Terminal (SDT) is required to provide third party access to terminal services on terms approved by the Essential Services Commission of Victoria (ESCV). The current terms applying to third party access to the SDT expire on 30 June 2012.

Pacific National lodged a revised SDT Access Arrangement and Agreement with the ESCV in March 2012. The ESCV released a Draft Decision on this Access Arrangement in May.

Please find attached a revised version of the SDT Access Arrangement and Access Agreement which incorporates all of the changes required by the ESCV in its Draft Decision. In addition the attached revised version includes a minor change related to TEU handling charges which has been discussed and agreed with ESCV officers.

This revised version has been provided as a marked up version, with changes made to the version submitted in March 2012, and as a clean version.
