


Greater Metropolitan Water Price Review South East Water:

Final decision outcomes for 2013-14 to 2017-18


Breakdown of costs*

The ESC's final decision has approved a reduction of South East Water's proposed costs of 7.7% (or \$350 million) over the five years from 2013-14**.




Prices*

The ESC's final decision has approved an increase in average prices of 22.84% over the five years from 2013-14**.



Indicative household bills (owner-occupier)*

The ESC's final decision has approved that over the next five years, indicative South East Water household bills would be reduced by \$553**.



^{*}Indicative bills are based on consumption for owner-occupier households.

Key Final Decision Outcomes

Expenditure

Operating Expenditure

- The Commission's final decision has adopted operating expenditure of \$3.2 billion.
- This is \$246.8 million (7.2 per cent) lower than the proposed expenditure of \$3.4 billion.

Capital Expenditure

- South East Water proposed capital expenditure of \$1.13 billion.
- The Commission's final decision has adopted capital expenditure of \$1.14 billion.
- This is \$0.9 billion (or 0.1 per cent) higher than the proposed capital expenditure by South East Water.

Tariffs

Retail Water Tariffs

- South East Water proposed to maintain a three tier inclining block tariff.
- South East Water currently charges \$1.75 per kilolitre for the first tier water price.
- From 2013-14, it proposed to charge \$ \$2.59, increasing with inflation to 2017-18.
- In its final decision, the Commission has approved the price structure of residential and non-residential retail water tariffs proposed by South East Water.

Sewerage Tariffs

- South East Water proposed to maintain a two part tariff structure a fixed component and a variable component for residential and non-residential sewerage tariffs.
- South East Water proposed a sewerage disposal volume factor of 75 per cent of metered water consumption for houses and 85 per cent for apartments.
- The Commission proposes to approve South East Water's, proposal to maintain existing tariff structures for residential and non-residential sewerage services.

Customer Support

- The Commission continues to emphasise the importance of water retailers ensuring customers experiencing hardship receive assistance and treated fairly.
- The water retailers, Victorian Government and Commonwealth Government provide a range of programs to assist customers experiencing financial hardship.
- In its final decision, the Commission has allowed an additional \$2 million for South East Water to assist low income and vulnerable customers in managing the impact of the proposed price increases.
- We will monitor implementation of measures to assist customers experiencing hardship and report on our findings in our annual performance reports.
