In the 2024/25 budget, Council has resolved to making \$1.5 million in operating savings and is now working with community and Councillors to ensure our long-term financial viability. In 2025/26 financial year Council needs to find an additional \$4 million in long-term savings and/or revenue to develop a financially responsible long-term financial plan that delivers on our shared Community Vision.

### **Managing Council's Revenue**

When exploring opportunities to improve Council's financial environment, we have considered the following financial levers: alternate income streams, increasing borrowings, and seeking a rate cap variation from State Government.

During the development of the 2024-2025 Budget, Council explored options to attract additional income, such as grants and user-pays fees, but these will not generate sufficient revenue to support long term sustainability. Grant funding will continue to be sought, as we have successfully done in the past, to support community projects and infrastructure. The sale of Council owned assets will not address long-term sustainability. Council has limited property and land that can be sold, with many of the assets that Council manages being jointly owned and therefore unable to be sold.

The Victorian State Government's rate capping system limits the amount councils can raise their rates each year. Applying for an increase to the State Government would support our ability to deliver projects and maintain the services Council provides. Any additional rate increase will be on top of the amount nominated by the State Government. A Rates Information Sheet has been created to support your engagement. The table above demonstrates the link between increased rates and the amounts still needing to be found in operational savings. For example, if average rates were to rise by 4%, the additional rate payable per week on average would be \$1.35. This would mean that \$3,166,000 would still need to be found in operational savings.
