

Hepburn Shire Council higher cap application



I wish to raise an objection to Hepburn Shire Council's request for a 10% increase in the rate cap. My family own a property in Hepburn Shire.

I believe that they have misrepresented to you their reasons for the increase, in particular they have not disclosed to you their financial mismanagement in the purchase, attempted renovation and then sale of The Rex building in Daylesford. The Rex was supposed to be the community hub building for Daylesford.



The council spent a substantial amount of money on the renovation, uncompleted, then sold the building for a huge loss, totalling millions of dollars.

I believe that this gross mismanagement of a substantial amount of money is the real cause for the funding shortfall facing council now.

Furthermore, I believe council has misrepresented community acceptance of a rate rise. If you refer to their community survey, and the results, I believe you will see that they have biased the questions, and more especially the misrepresented the results to you.
