Rates and Charges: \$8m

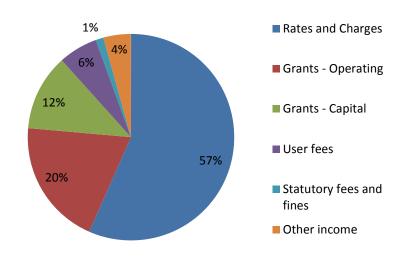
FTE: 64 (employee costs: \$6m)

Higher Rate Cap

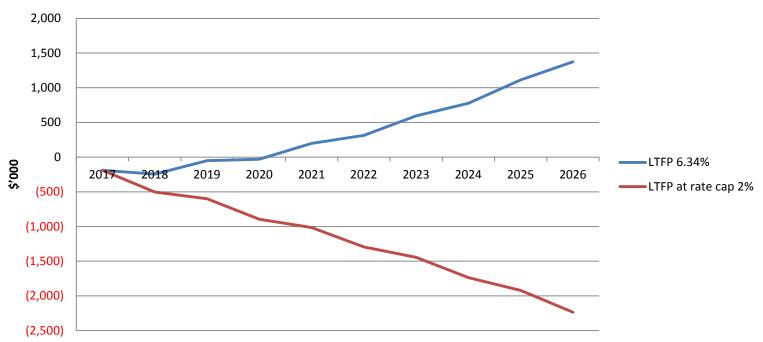


2016/17 **6.34%** (1 year)

Context: a 1% increase to rates and municipal charge yields an additional \$65,000

Record numbers

196 participants = 3.3% of our population





Community Forums

CEO presentation then...

FIVE questions

- What do we do well?
- What would you like us to do better?
- Two or three projects or programs you would like to see delivered?
- Are you getting 'Value for money' and if not, why not? (How do you measure 'value for money'?)
- What rate increase (if any) are you prepared to pay to maintain the current level of services and infrastructure? And what are you prepared to do without?

How was the feedback used?

- Feedback was collated and grouped:
 - 1. **Operational** issues
 - 2. Items for inclusion in the Council Plan
- Informed 'new' Council (and staff)
- Confirmed the higher cap application was 'the right thing to do'
- All participants were emailed a copy of collated feedback





Evaluation?

We kept it pretty simple...

- **Survey** (4 questions)
- Direct feedback (email and verbal)
- Internal reflection (Councillors and senior staff)



Survey Results

85%* said they had appropriate opportunity to provide input into the future direction of Council
