Hi there,

I would like to make a comment re the solar feed in tariff for your consideration. I'm fortunate to be on a high feed-in tariff but for customers receiving only 5c kWh that is just absurd. I suggest that the feed in tariff should be linked to the price per kWh that the retailer charges the customer. For example 50% of the cost to the customer should be received back for any excess solar power fed back into the grid, with no maximum limits. That way nobody gets ripped off. Retailers obtain a source of cheap power, especially during the peak periods when solar is producing at it's peak, and customers get a reasonable and fair rate for the power they put back into the grid.

We should be encouraging more solar rooftop systems in order to reduce our reliance on dirty coal-powered stations (and there is no such thing as clean coal) to help the environment and reduce pollution.
